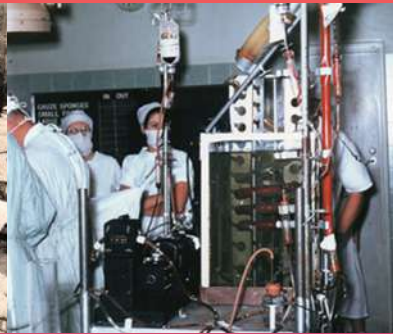
1871

Funded through the generosity of the Victorian community, The Alfred officially opens its hospital doors to patients on 6 March 1871.



1918

Countless lives are saved at The Alfred as the Spanish Flu pandemic strikes. That lifesaving emergency care continues today with our pivotal role in the recent COVID-19 crisis.



1957

Australia's first ever open-heart surgery was performed at The Alfred by Mr Ken Morris. Today The Alfred's heart surgery, research and education program is internationally recognised.



1983

The Alfred sends a mobile medical team to treat victims of the Ash Wednesday bushfires, heralding a new era for our world-renowned burns care excellence.

1990

Australia's first dedicated trauma centre is opened at The Alfred, which includes Victoria's largest helipad, built for responding to mass emergencies.

The Alfred plays a significant role in treating some of the most severely wounded patients of the infamous Bali Bombings, in which 88 Australians sadly lost their lives.

2020

In conjunction with The Alfred Research Alliance and Nucleus Network, The Alfred hosts the first human trial for a COVID-19 vaccine in the southern hemisphere.

2021

The Alfred celebrates its 150-year anniversary of providing truly extraordinary lifesaving care, always here to care for our patients and their loved ones.

We care for more than 700,000 locals who live in inner-southern Melbourne. We also provide health services for Victorians experiencing the most acute and complex conditions through our 14 statewide services.

The hospital is home to one of Australia's busiest Intensive Care Units and we are pioneers in trauma care.

Patients also come to The Alfred for speciality services like cancer care, respiratory medicine, cardiovascular and neurological services and psychiatry care.

We operate Victoria's only heart and lung transplant service, the Victorian Adults Burn Service and the Victorian Melanoma Service.

“The Alfred has saved three members of my family. I’ve always thought it was a truly special place,” says David.

The first member of David’s family saved by the team at The Alfred was his mother.

In the 1960s, she received lifesaving open heart surgery – an innovative procedure at the time.

Almost a decade later, his twin brother received critical care

after a car accident left him in a coma for more than six months.

More recently, his wife Margaret was given expert care at The Alfred following her heart attack.

David is now forever grateful:

“That’s three times now I’ve witnessed first-hand the impact that The Alfred can have on people’s lives,” he says.

With this grateful connection to The Alfred spanning more than 40 years, David and Margaret were only too happy to support us by including a gift to the hospital in their Wills.

A second chance



For 27 days, Patrick clung to life in The Alfred Intensive Care Unit, rushed there by ambulance after collapsing at home. It was just two days after

his 50th wedding anniversary. His wife Ros was told to say her final goodbyes to him.

"I had a massive infection resulting in sepsis," explains Patrick. "I was unconscious, and most of my organs were in failure."

"I was described as the sickest patient in ICU. Ros had all the pressure, as I remember none of this. She saw me with a multitude of tubes down my throat and a battery of equipment and monitoring screens around me."

"The Alfred could not have done more. They provided the world's best medicine."

After 11 weeks in hospital, Patrick was finally well enough to go home. He is clear about

the reason he is so supportive and grateful to the hospital:

"I now have a second chance, thanks to The Alfred."

Jenny and husband Bruce now have the rest of their lives to spend together, thanks to Bruce’s lifesaving treatment in The Alfred Intensive Care Unit, following a stroke.

“I knew he was in the right place, with the right people,” Jenny says.



“The four weeks Bruce was in hospital were traumatising – for him and me. The staff do their utmost. This is an amazing place of hope and healing.”

Jenny and her two brothers are also patients at The Alfred, as was their father, over 50 years ago. They’ve inherited his high cholesterol condition, and the siblings know they owe their own lives to the treatment they receive at The Alfred.

“Sadly Dad passed away when he was only 47, but the fact that he was well cared for means a lot to me.

With a gift to The Alfred in my Will, I can help it continue being the incredible place that it is, helping so many others.”

Inspired to give

"If it hadn't been for the skilled surgeons at The Alfred, I definitely wouldn't be walking today."

Kevin had just finished cleaning the gutters on his roof when the ladder buckled underneath him and he fell to the ground, landing on his back. He was airlifted by helicopter directly to The Alfred emergency unit.

"From having major surgery to being expertly nursed and compassionately cared for - the people at The Alfred knew exactly what to do," Kevin says

After months of intensive rehabilitation, Kevin finally returned home. He set himself a challenge, and has now completed his PhD in Political Science.

"Remembering The Alfred in my Will was really a simple decision," he says. "I want my gift to help those who were there for me. I wouldn't want anyone to go through what I did, but chances are many of us are going to have an accident sooner or later.

"That's why we will always need a great hospital like The Alfred."



Always making the impossible possible

The Alfred is playing a significant role in responding to the global COVID-19 pandemic through delivering extensive testing, providing critical lifesaving care and driving research.

In partnership with The Alfred Research Alliance we have been involved with more than thirty COVID-19-related research projects. This includes working with Nucleus Network to run the first human trials for a COVID-19 vaccine in the Southern Hemisphere.



“With COVID-19 we were told to prepare for the absolute worst case scenario. We tripled our treatment capacity within the emergency department, adding over 150 treatment spaces.”

Always here to care

The Alfred runs the only lung transplant service for children aged 4-16 in Australia.

"Witnessing children so sick with end-stage lung disease transform into being lively kids, full of energy, that's the ultimate reward," says nurse Belinda Bourne, a Paediatric Transplant Coordinator.

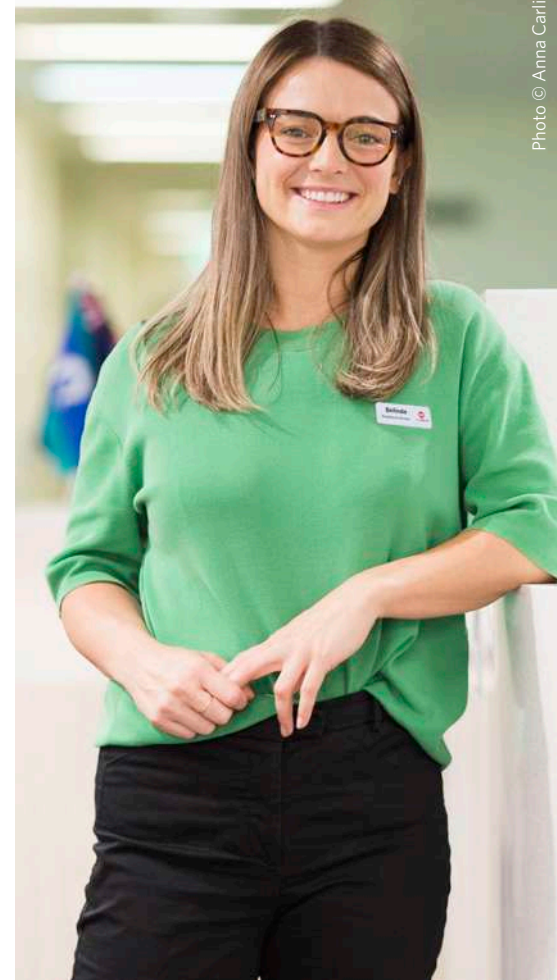
Belinda plays a pivotal role supporting children and their families from across the country throughout their lung transplant journey.

One of the children she cared for recently was Callan, from Sydney. Diagnosed with Acute Myeloid Leukaemia at 18-months old, Callan received his lung transplant at The Alfred aged just six.

Because transplantation and organ availability are so unpredictable, Callan – like most transplant patients – needed to travel to The Alfred at a moment's notice. As his mum Lisa said, *"Belinda made the transition so easy."*

"I'm proud to be part of a dedicated team, committed to providing the best possible care for a patient like Callan and his family," Belinda explains.

"Our patients rely so heavily on us. They may be hundreds of kilometres away from their homes, and trusting us to help them is so crucial."

Remembering The Alfred in your Will

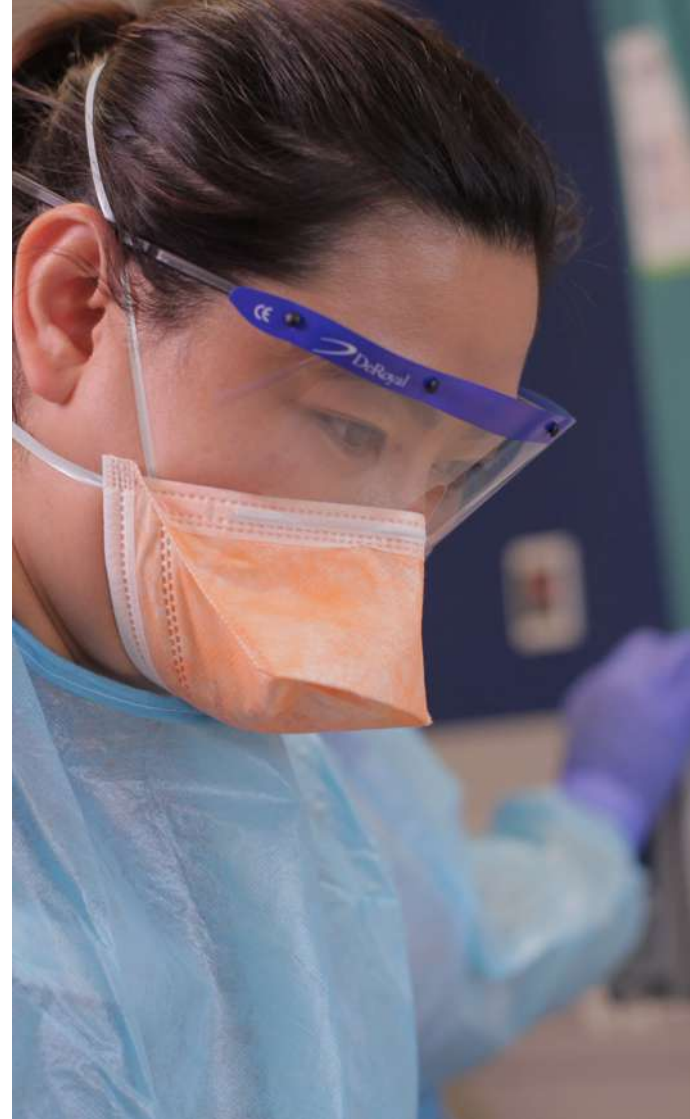
It's such an easy thing to do. There are a few important things to remember when including a gift to The Alfred in your Will:

- Use our correct name: **The Alfred**
- Add our address: **55 Commercial Road, Melbourne, Victoria 3004**
- Use the right reference: **ABN 27 318 956 319**
- Describe the type of gift you would like to leave to The Alfred.

Your gift should ideally be left for **The Alfred's general purposes**. This helps us to make sure your gift can be used for the greatest need at the time it is received.

It would be incredibly helpful if you could discuss your final wishes with us in advance. That way, if there is anything specific or unusual about your gift, we will know about the details well in advance.

Finding out a bit more about the gift in your Will also helps us to understand the reasons behind your decision so that we can properly honour your final wishes.
