# HOW TO BEGIN

*It's a simple process to leave a donation in your Will to your favourite charities.*

1. **Choose the family, friends and charities** that you would like to remember in your Will.
2. **Talk it over with your family and loved ones.** Share your vision with them.
3. **Choose the type of Bequest** you would like to leave to your favourite charities:
  - A *residuary gift* is a way of passing on the residue of your estate to your chosen beneficiaries, once you've provided for your loved ones.
  - A *percentage of your estate* specifies the share that each of your beneficiaries receive.
  - A *pecuniary gift* is a stated sum of money.

You may wish to use the following wording:

*I give to World Wide Fund for Nature Australia ABN 57 001 594 074 (the residue of my estate / a \_\_\_% share of my estate / the sum of \$\_\_\_) for its general purposes, and the receipt given on behalf of the World Wide Fund for Nature Australia shall be sufficient discharge to my trustee.*

4. **Visit a solicitor** to have your Will written or updated.

WWF-Australia is a member of *Charity Wills*, a free online legal Will making service for those wishing to include WWF in their Will.
